17/15 **PRESENTATION BY NORMAN TREBILCOCK FROM FLEET**

The Council received a presentation regarding Fleet defibrillators.

18/15 **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION**

None

19/15 **APOLOGIES**

Apologies were received and accepted from Councillor Carey, Councillor Cross and
Councillor Greenaway.

20/15 **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

Councillor Webber declared a non registerable interest in Planning Application PA15/02975
Councillor Miss Meads declared a pecuniary interest in Planning Application PA15/02879

21/15 **COMMUNITY POLICE REPORT**

None

22/15 **BLISLAND EMERGENCY PLAN**

As Councillor Cross has been unable to attend the meeting the clerk was instructed to defer this agenda
item until the June meeting.

23/15 **CORNWALL COUNCILLOR REPORT**

Cornwall Councillor Batters advised the meeting that he has been dealing with a number of issues
locally including removal of fingerpost signs, bedroom tax and policing. Cornwall Councillor Batters
advised that he recently attended the Community Network Meeting which was advised that if rural areas
experience little or no crime there will be no Police patrols in the area.

24/15 HIGHWAYS & FOOTPATHS

Cornwall Councillor Batters was asked if he would be able to assist with the overgrown privet opposite the entrance to Lavethan Mill as it is restricting visibility for road users.

25/15 FOOTPATHS TENDER

It was proposed by Councillor Runnalls and seconded by Councillor Montague that the footpath tender of £800 is accepted. This proposal received the support of the Council.

26/15 A30 TEMPLE TO HIGHER CARBLAKE

Council discussed the liaison group meeting notes received prior to the meeting from Councillor Mrs Carey. Council was advised that the main site compound on the Cardinham airfield road is almost complete and approximately 35 staff are already undertaking preparatory work. At the end of the month/beginning of June works will start to strip back the top soil. The Environmental Management of the site is closely monitored and if sections of Cornish hedge need to be removed they will be replaced with the same stone whenever possible.

During construction all junctions will be left turn only and the 40mph limit will be strictly enforced.

27/15 PLANNING APPLICATIONS

- a) PA15/02975 Land East of the Chalet Tresarrett Blisland
Installation of a 25m high shared mobile phone base station lattice tower with antennas for the Mobile Infrastructure Project.

Councillor Mrs Webber having previously declared a non registerable interest left the meeting room.

It was proposed by Councillor Fairman and seconded by Councillor Runnalls that Blisland Parish Council supports this application. This proposal received the support of the Council.

Councillor Mrs Webber rejoined the meeting.

- PA15/02879 Bluebells road from Tregenna Road to Trewint Hill Blisland
Construction of garage and new driveway

Councillor Miss Meads briefly addressed the Council and left the meeting room.

It was proposed by Councillor Fairman and seconded by Councillor Mrs Pope that Blisland Parish Council supports this application. The Council considers that the proposed development will be partially screened by the existing hedge and will improve highway access to the property.

Councillor Miss Meads rejoined the meeting.

28/15 PLANNING DECISIONS

- PA15/01844 7 Manor Close, Blisland
New single storey dwelling with lower level living accommodation to rear and plant room. - *Approved*
- PA15/02156 Red Barn Blisland
Proposed extension to provide garage – *Approved*
- PA15/02451 Hawthorn Lodge Waterloo Blisland
Application for works to fell one sycamore tree (T1) due to poor health subject to Tree Preservation Order – *Approved*

29/15 DEFIBRILLATOR

- (i) It was proposed by Councillor Miss Meads and seconded by Councillor Bogle that Blisland Parish Council supports the provision of a defibrillator located on the outside wall of the Shop & Post Office. This proposal received the support of the Council.
- (ii) It was further proposed by Councillor Bogle and seconded by Councillor Miss Meads that Blisland Parish Council applies to Cornwall Councillor Batters Community Chest Fund for funding. This proposal also received the support of the Council.
- (iii) The Council hoped parishioners attending the Parish Assembly next week would be interested in the training.

30/15 BLISLAND VILLAGE GREEN – CHURCH FETE

It was proposed by Councillor Mrs Webber and seconded by Councillor Miss Meads that Blisland Parish Council grants permission for the use of Blisland Village Green for the Church Fete on 20 June. This proposal received the support of the Council.

31/15 BLISLAND FUN DAY & DOG SHOW

The email received was read to Council. It was proposed by Councillor Fairman and seconded by Councillor Miss Meads that the clerk is instructed to contact the Fun Day organisers and acknowledge their concerns but highlight that it is likely the Institute will not be available for this year's event. This proposal received the support of the Council.

32/15 NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

- (i) Minutes – It was proposed by Councillor Bogle and seconded by Councillor Montague that the Neighbourhood Working party minutes are removed from the Parish Council website. This proposal received the support of the Council.
- (ii) Progress report – Councillor Fairman advised that the grant has been applied for and that the working party continues to talk informally with CRCC. The date of 13 June has been earmarked for the first full consultation in the Village Hall. The series of displays planned will include: - What is a Neighbourhood Plan? Different types of housing, designs of new housing, where development should or should not happen in the village & renewable energy. The displays will be 'tested' at the Annual Parish Assembly next week. The approach will be to start with a blank canvas to gauge views and encourage residents to express their views on their Parish. It was proposed by Councillor Runnalls and seconded by Councillor Mrs Pope that this approach is endorsed by the Council. This proposal received the support of the Council.
- (iii) Grant Funding – The Council was advised that as part of the application process the funders will require the Date of Birth of all account signatories.
- (iv) Neighbourhood Plan element of Annual Parish Meeting - please see (ii) above.

33/15 CASE FOR CORNWALL

It was proposed by Councillor Fairman and seconded by Councillor Runnalls that Blisland Parish Council does not submit a formal response to the Cornwall Council – Case for Cornwall.

As it was 10pm the clerk requested that the Council consider in accordance with Blisland Parish Council Standing Orders the deferment of all further agenda items to the next Council meeting.

It was proposed by Councillor Miss Meads and seconded by Councillor Mrs Webber that all further items with the exception of Accounts & Finance are deferred. This proposal received the support of the Council.

34/15 ACCOUNTS & FINANCE

The clerk reported the bank balances to Council. It was proposed by Councillor Miss Meads and seconded by Councillor Mrs Webber that the cheques presented for payment totalling £1422.30 are authorised for payment (App 1). This proposal received the support of the Council.

The meeting was advised by Councillor Runnalls that for Building Regulation purposes it is going to be necessary to obtain a Mining Report for the Institute at a cost of approximately £60. It was proposed by Councillor Bogle and seconded by Councillor Mrs Webber that the purchase of a mining report is authorised. This proposal also received the support of the Council.
