The council awaits any requests from the PCC in future. b) Alleged unauthorised display of an advertisement along the A30: Cllr Cruse updated the meeting with regards to the incorrect address being on the Enforcement Notice sent to the council. Cllr Cruse has a copy of the correct one and will forward to the Clerk.
22-02/05 JC	CORNWALL COUNCILLOR'S REPORT The meeting received the monthly Cornwall Councillor's Report from Councillor Jennifer Cruse: Possible funding threats effecting Localism is a concern. There a fewer officers and areas will be re-allocated. Staff have thankfully been retained by Cornwall Council (CC). The Climate Emergency DPD has gone to the inspector for approval. If approved, it will hold full weight in planning applications. Ecology Emergency passed at CC Full Council which will also help with environmental matters. The CC Budget has been confirmed at a 1.9% increase, with an added 1% levy specifically for adult social care. The GP surgeries have questionnaires 'in house' in relation to the new building. Cllr Green raised the problem with increased capacity: It was agreed that the capacity of the new surgery will not meet the increased need given plans already approved by CC for new housing in the area. The Community Network Highways Scheme deadline was highlighted. The new CC Mapping Facility was mentioned; as the link which Cllr Cruse had forwarded to the Clerk did not work. Cllr Cruse clarified its use. She agreed to help source access for Blisland Parish Council (BPC). Case Assist was mentioned as being useful. The Clerk confirmed that she had done the Case Assist training. Omicron Funding for second home owners in Cornwall: They need to apply for the funding as it was advised by Queens council it could not be withheld. CC hoped second home owners would look to their conscience and act accordingly.

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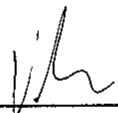
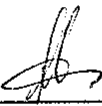

She mentioned his suggestion of a person who may be that same age as the queen joining him. d) The planting of trees in the parish was discussed as part of the celebrations and the Queen's Green Canopy. Cllr Cruse mentioned her allocation of trees and offered purchasing Rowan trees for the event. She asked for assistance with the actual planting. Cllr Green offered to contact the Woodland Trust in order to house the trees. It was suggested that the 'Jubilee Rowan' be planted on the Village Green. Cllr Cruse has written to the Village School but has not received a reply. The Village Hall plans were discussed. The Clerk to contact the Village Hall Committee again about their plans. BPC will put up the bunting around the green in the hope that a Tea Party or Picnic would be organised by other people. Cllr Spencer offered to advertise for ideas and volunteers on the website and social media. Cllr Dickin offered to write an article about it for the Parish magazine.
22-02/15	Duchy Defibrillators To RECEIVE information: a) Cllr Spencer reported that the shop was reluctant to press the button on the defibrillator to ensure the weekly check was carried out. He and Cllr Meads have volunteered to do it.
22-02/16 Clerk	Institute The meeting RECEIVED information: a) EDF and South West water have now changed the details to the new Clerk's. b) Insurance update on events cover: The Clerk informed the meeting that BPC's insurance only offers cover if BPC run and book hiring and functions on site. This is in place to ensure coverage. Cllr Lowden asked about insurance for functions on the Village Green. The Clerk informed the meeting that those people will need their own Public Liability Insurance, as BPC are only covered for the 'ground'. The Clerk was asked to get details of Village Green function insurance cover for Blisland Fayre and other events should they wish to use our insurers.
22-02/17 Clerk Clerk Clerk	Village Green The meeting RECEIVED information on: a) The grant proposal for Blisland Fayre Committee was discussed. The breakdown of estimated costs supplied by David Pyle was reviewed. Earmarked reserves of £1000.00 were confirmed for this purpose. Blisland Fayre's need to set up a body to receive funds was discussed. Councillors involved with the project brought up 'conflict of interest' in this regards. the Clerk offered to look into this. The Clerk to write to David Pyle to confirm support in principal. BPC AGREED unanimously to support Blisland Fayre's future Grant Application for £1500.00 in principal. Put on agenda for next month.
